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Opening Remarks by Our Summit Co-Chair - Dr. Satpal Singh



Dr. Satpal Singh is Professor Emeritus of Medicine and Biomedical Sciences at the State University of New York at Buffalo. His research focused on understanding and combating neurodegenerative diseases, and he used to run an annual summer-long research program at Cambridge University, UK. Dr. Singh is a 1984 Sikh genocide survivor. He is a founding trustee of the Sikh Council for Interfaith Relations, is a key promoter of interfaith harmony, and has represented Sikhi in many forums including delivering a prayer on peace and harmony along with Pope Francis. He is a regular Op-Ed writer for the Washington Post and the Huffington Post.

Dr. Kamaljit Kaur Sidhu has over 30 years' experience as an educator and registered psychologist in British Columbia. She has worked with individuals across the lifespan, including elementary, high school and university level students. Dr. Sidhu completed her Ph.D. in Counselling Psychology from the University of British Columbia (2000). Her research interests have been in self and identity construction of Sikh adolescents and migrant populations. She has served on appointed and elected boards including board member for the British Columbia School Counsellors' Association and board member and President for the British Columbia Psychological Association. In addition to her private practice in psychology, Dr. Sidhu continues to volunteer to promote community education about mental health through media interviews, workshops and presentations to professionals and the public.

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Dinner Keynote - The Hon. Harjit Singh Sajjan



The Honourable Harjit Singh Sajjan is a trailblazer in Canadian politics and a role model for youth. From his early life in South Vancouver to becoming Canada's first Sikh Minister of National Defence, Sajjan's journey exemplifies resilience, leadership, and dedication. A decorated soldier, Sajjan served as a lieutenant-colonel in the Canadian Armed Forces, earning the Meritorious Service Medal and the Order of Military Merit, and became the first Sikh to command a Canadian Army regiment. A former Vancouver Police detective specializing in gang crime, he was elected as MP for Vancouver South in 2015. He has served as Minister of National Defence, Minister of International Development, and is currently the President of the King's Privy Council for Canada, Minister of Emergency Preparedness of Canada, Minister responsible for the Pacific Economic Development Agency of Canada. His unwavering commitment to Canada and dedication to community service continue to inspire the next generation to pursue their dreams with determination and integrity.

Neesha is a passionate executive with 17 years of experience in events, marketing and communications and a resounding entrepreneurial spirit which has helped her successfully run her own agency for over a decade. She has worked across a variety of arts, culture, lifestyle and entertainment brands. Dinner EMCEE- Sandip Kaur Sodhi





She completed her B.A., B.Ed. and teacher-librarian qualification from the University of British Columbia, and her post baccalaureate diploma in technology from Simon Fraser University. SUMMIT KEYNOTE SPEAKERS

September 28 & 29, 2024
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Saturday Opening Keynote - Dr. Alastair Summerlee



Dr. Summerlee is a passionate humanitarian, dedicated teacher, and internationally renowned researcher. He served as president and vice-chancellor of the University of Guelph from 2003 to 2014, interim president and vice-chancellor at Carleton University from 2017 to 2018, and was a professor of Biomedical Science from 1989 to 2017. He is currently an adjunct professor at the Sprott Business School at Carleton and an adjunct professor emeritus in biomedical science at the University of Guelph.

Dr. Summerlee served for six years on the board of the World University Service of Canada. During this time, he became involved in humanitarian efforts in the refugee camps in Kenya. His work focused on raising funds to support education for women and girls on campus, which attracted international investment from the governments of Canada and the UK, as well as from private individuals. Furthermore, Dr. Summerlee is part of the international movement known as the PUSH Initiative (President's United to Solve Hunger), which aims to unite universities worldwide in fighting hunger and poverty. In 2012, he was honoured as the International Quality of Life Laureate at the United Nations.

Dr. Summerlee has published numerous scientific articles about teaching and teaching practice, advocated in the media for better conditions in refugee camps and is regularly invited to speak on teaching, research, accountability, fund-raising and sustainable business. His current research focuses on iron deficiency and a simple innovation, known as the Lucky Iron Fish which can alleviate the condition for almost 2 billion people worldwide. He is also serving as a Special Advisor on Carleton University's capital campaign and the interim leader of Education City – an initiative to provide educational innovation in the Ottawa region.

Sunday Opening Keynote - Dr. Manjeet Kaur Ramgotra

Manjeet Kaur Ramgotra is a Senior Lecturer in Political Theory at the Department of Politics and International Studies at SOAS University of London. She is the co-editor of a major new textbook called 'Rethinking Political Thinkers' published by Oxford University Press that reimagines the field of political theory. This textbook was inspired by her teaching that takes into account the colonial contexts in which much European political thinking was produced and brings to the fore marginalized thinkers who often challenged colonialist and patriarchal structures of power and thinking. Her research examines the history of republican ideas extending from classical European thought of Cicero, Machiavelli and Montesquieu to anticolonial political theory. Currently, she is working on a project on republicanism in the Indian anticolonial movement. She has published numerous articles on republicanism and on decolonising the curriculum, including a co-edited volume on Decolonising Curricula and Pedagogy in Higher Education (2020). She was a research fellow of the Independent Social Research Foundation in 2020-21. Since 2020, she has been a trustee of the Political Studies Association (PSA) Executive Committee for which she chairs the PSA EDI Working Group.

Internationalizing Higher Education: Challenges and Best Practices

Moderator - Dr. Victor V. Ramraj



Dr. Victor V. Ramraj is an accomplished law professor and CAPI (Centre for Asia Pacific Initiatives) Director at the University of Victoria. He previously spent 16 years at the National University of Singapore, where he twice served as the Faculty's Vice-Dean for Academic Affairs and twice seconded to the Center for Transnational Legal Studies in London. With five degrees from McGill Montreal, U of T Toronto and Queens University Belfast, his expertise includes Asian State company relations, comparative law, and transnational regulation. Dr Ramraj also served as a judicial law clerk at the Federal Court of Appeal in Ottawa, a litigation lawyer in Toronto, and leads the Advanced Scholars (QES-AS) funded research project, Regulating Globalization in South and Southeast Asia, with collaborations across multiple countries.

Panelist - Tricia Best

Tricia Best has an MA in Counselling Psychology from Simon Fraser University and is the Director, International Centre for Students at the University of Victoria (UVic). In this role she is responsible for strategic leadership and the oversight of services, programs and resources that support international students, provide international mobility and intercultural opportunities for domestic and international students, and advance the goals and objectives of UVic's Strategic Plans. Tricia has worked at UVic for 25 years including working as a counsellor, workshop facilitator and student leadership coordinator. Throughout her time at UVic, Tricia has supported and advocated for building a welcoming, diverse and globally-minded learning community at UVic. Her work and interests focus on student support and mobility, diversity and equity, social justice, international partner development, intercultural fluency and internationalization in higher education.



Panelist - Dr. Pooja Parmar



Dr. Parmar is an Associate Professor at the UVic Faculty of Law, specializing in legal pluralism, legal ethics, international human rights law, legal history, and law and colonialism. She holds a Ph.D. in Law from UBC and has previously taught at Carleton University, Osgoode Hall Law School, and UBC Faculty of Law. Since joining UVic in 2015, Dr. Parmar has focused her research on the legal profession, its history, and ethical lawyering. Her current projects include a SSHRC-funded study of Indigenous laws as sources of ethical legal practice in BC, and research on legal professionals in Canada, India, and Bhutan. Dr. Parmar's book, *Indigeneity and Legal Pluralism in India: Claims, Histories, Meanings*, explore Indigenous protests against a Coca-Cola facility. She teaches legal ethics and professionalism, property law, and international human rights law, and supervises graduate research on legal history, Indigenous rights, and social justice. She is a board member of the Canadian Association for Legal Ethics (CALE) and serves the editorial board of the Canadian Journal of Law & Society.



Panelist - Dr. Sharanjit Kaur Sandhra

Dr. Sharanjit Kaur is a respected historian, publisher, and dedicated educator, sharing her expertise teaching at UBC, UFV, and GNI. Dr. Sandhra has enriched the research field with significant scholarly contributions. She co-authored "Challenging Racist BC: 150 Years and Counting" and "A Social History of South Asians in British Columbia." These publications exemplify her commitment to tackling racism and exploring the rich history and experiences of South Asians in BC, reinforcing her stature as a prominent figure in her field.



Panelist - Jaskaran Singh Benipal



Jaskaran came to Canada in 2016 as an international student at Langara College. Since 2022, he acts as the Executive Director at Exporior Financial Group. He also co-founded "We Care Canada," the country's largest international non-profit student organization with over 20,000 members. Initially focused on providing settlement services for newcomers, including employment and accommodation support, the organization quickly expanded its mandate to address mental health issues, collaborating with the South Asian Mental Health Alliance (SAMHA), South Asian Health Institute (SAHI), and Fraser Health Authority. During COVID-19, Jaskaran led a team of 38 volunteers to deliver essential groceries to students in need. Team We Care Canada continues to support students through bi-weekly webinars and monthly social gatherings under the program "Baithak."

Sikh Scientists' Contribution to Global Wheat Production

Dr. Kulvinder Singh Gill

Dr. Gill earned his BSc in Agriculture (Hons) in 1981 and MSc in Plant Breeding in 1983 from Punjab Agricultural University before completing his PhD in Genetics at Kansas State University (KSU) in 1990. He remained at KSU as a postdoctoral researcher and Senior Scientist before joining the University of Nebraska, Lincoln, as a cytogeneticist and Assistant Professor. In 2002, he became the first Vogel Endowed Chair Professor at Washington State University. Dr. Gill has published over 200 scientific papers, holds an H-index of 59 and an i10-index of 145, developed four wheat varieties, and holds six patents. His research spans multiple countries, including India, Pakistan, Nepal, and Egypt, and he has founded six companies. Notable achievements include developing rapid breeding methods, cloning the Ph1 gene in wheat, creating 36 wheat germplasms with resistance genes, and demonstrating the utility of candidate gene approaches and advanced genetic tools, significantly advancing wheat genetics and breeding.

Energy Sustainability in Built Environments: Path from Policies to Implementation

Dr. Kuljeet Singh Grewal

Dr. Kuljeet S. Grewal is an Assistant Professor at the University of Prince Edward Island's Faculty of Sustainable Design Engineering. He established the Future Urban Energy Lab for Sustainability (FUEL-S) in 2021, focusing on sustainable neighbourhoods, energy design, and net-zero approaches that integrate engineering, architecture, land use planning, and policymaking. Dr. Grewal earned his Ph.D. in Mechanical Engineering from IIT Ropar in 2018 and has a B.Eng. in Mechanical Engineering and an M.Eng. in Thermal Engineering from Thapar Institute of Engineering and Technology. He previously worked as a Postdoctoral Researcher at the University of Calgary from 2018 to 2021. He has co-led a subtask within Task 63: Solar Neighborhood Planning of the International Energy Agency (IEA) and served as a Guest Editor for two special issues in the *Energies Journal*. With 36 peer-reviewed journal articles, 4 IEA reports, and several conference proceedings and book chapters to his credit, Dr. Grewal leads numerous funded research projects through NSERC, provincial governments, NRC, MITACS, and industry partners, focusing on community-led transitions and innovative energy modelling techniques to promote long-term sustainability.

Food and Nutritional Security: Contributions by Sikh Researchers

Dr. Jaswinder Singh



Dr. Jaswinder Singh is an Associate Professor in the Department of Plant Science at McGill University and an Associate Member of the Bieler School of Environment. He completed his Ph.D. at the University of Sydney and CSIRO, Canberra, followed by postdoctoral studies at the University of California, Berkeley. His research focuses on genomics, molecular breeding, and biotechnology, notably reversing epigenetic silencing and identifying novel barley genes related to Pre-Harvest Sprouting (PHS) and β -glucan activity. His team also explores cysteine-rich proteins, redox regulation, and transcription factors in plant phase transitions. Dr. Singh teaches "Plant Breeding" and "Biotechnology" and directs the multi-institutional NSERC-CREATE program on "Genome Editing for Food Security and Environmental Sustainability." He has published 65 research articles and delivered over 60 invited talks. Dr. Singh has trained more than 50 researchers and received numerous accolades, including the prestigious C. D. Nelson Award in 2018. In 2020, he was recognized as one of McGill's top 50 Professors for his visionary contributions.

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
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
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
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
